

FABRIC + LEATHER CARE

Fabric Care

Most fabrics feature cleaning codes, as reflected below. Please refer to the individual textile manufacturer's website for additional information regarding the care and maintenance of specific fabrics.

Code S

Only mild, pure, water-free dry cleaning may be used for cleaning. Cleaning by a professional service is recommended.

Code W-S

Water-base cleaning agents and foam may be used for cleaning. These fabrics may also be cleaned with mild, water-free solvents. Cleaning by a professional service is recommended.

Faux Leather/Vinyl/Polyurethanes

To maintain the quality and natural characteristics of faux leather and similar upholstery materials, gently dust area regularly with a dry, soft cloth. For cleaning up spills or stains, remove as much soil or staining material as possible by blotting with a clean, colorfast, absorbent cloth. Flush with water and dry with a clean cloth.

Warning: Do not use furniture polishes, oils, solvents, abrasive cleaners, ammonia or wax. Cleaning by a professional furniture service is recommended.

Leather

Genuine leather requires very little care. Arcadia recommends that leather be dusted regularly. If a more thorough cleaning is needed, use lukewarm water and a mild soap, but nothing abrasive. Generate some lather and lightly rub the surface with cheesecloth. Rinse off any soap film with clean water and towel dry. The leather may dry dull, however rubbing with a clean towel can restore to a normal gloss.

Warning: Never use furniture polish, oil, varnish or ammonia. Saddle soap may be used to prevent the leather from becoming brittle or cracking and to maintain the original, supple finish.
